About This Manual

Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter is a network interface card (NIC) designed for the peripheral component interconnect (PCI) bus, operating independently of the host processor. This product is also referred to as the PMC Adapter module in this manual.

This manual describes:

- The main features of the PMC Adapter module
- The RJ-45 connector and LEDs
- How to install the PMC Adapter module in your computer
- Problems you could encounter when you install the module and the possible solutions

To install the module, you need to understand the basic concepts and uses of Ethernet networks and be familiar with your system.

Introduction

This chapter describes the Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter module and summarizes its features. This chapter also describes the module's connector and LEDs.

Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter is a PCI Mezzanine Card (PMC) with a direct interface to the 32-bit PCI local bus. This dual-speed module uses a single connector for either a 10 megabits per second (10-Mb/s) or a 100 megabits per second (100-Mb/s) IEEE 802.3 Ethernet network connection. The module automatically senses and switches to the correct speed. For information about the Fast Ethernet technology, see Appendix D.

Features


The Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter module has the following features:

- High performance: full-speed, 32-bit DMA bus transfers at 132 MB/s
- Single-shielded or unshielded RJ-45 connection
- Automatic sensing of speed and change to that speed
- Powerful parallel cut-through architecture and other patented features to maximize data throughput and minimize CPU use
- 100BASE-TX (100 Mb/s) with UTP Category 5 cabling 10BASE-T (10 Mb/s) with UTP Category 3, 4, or 5 cabling
- Configurable by software to operate in full-duplex mode, increasing the aggregate bandwidth up to 20 Mb/s and 200 Mb/s

- Compliance with PCI revision 2.0 or later
- Compliance with FCC Class A and CISPR-22 Class A
- Lifetime warranty with return of the warranty registration card to Digital

Figure 1–2 Connector and LEDs



0	100 Mb/s status LED	An amber LED that lights when the 100-Mb/s mode is selected. This LED does not light when 10-Mb/s mode is selected.
•	Activity status LED	An amber LED that lights when an RX (receive) packet is received or a transmission (TX) is in process.
4	Link status LED	A green LED that lights and remains lit to indicate connection to an active network.



Preparing to Install the PMC Adapter Module

To prepare your system for installing the module:

1.	console prompt appears, shut off the power.		
	Caution		
	Make sure you turn off power to the computer before you insert or remove the module to avoid permanent damage to the module or computer circuitry.		


- 2. Remove the motherboard from the computer chassis according to the instructions in your computer documentation.
- 3. If you have not already done so, attach an antistatic ground strap to your wrist and clip the other end of the strap to the computer's chassis ground.
- 4. Remove the cover from the PMC slot.
- 5. Remove the module from the protective bag. The mounting hardware, screws, and standoffs are on the module. If the mounting hardware is misplaced, the replacement hardware is M2.5x5 mm screws (PN 90-10959-01) and M2.5 mm standoffs (PN 74-49014-04).

Installing the PMC Adapter Module

Use the following procedure to install the module:

- 1. Remove the screws from the standoffs on the module and set aside for use later in this procedure.
- 2. Insert the module's bezel into the cutout on the front panel of the motherboard $\mathbf{0}$, as shown in Figure 2–2.
- 3. Engage the connectors **2**, making sure they are seated completely.
- 4. Secure the four screws **3** through the clearance holes on the reverse side of the motherboard.
- 5. Replace the motherboard in the backplane.

Figure 2-2 Installing the PMC Adapter Module




Connecting to the Network

For automatic speed selection to work correctly, make sure you connect the module to the network before you load any device drivers.

To connect the Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter module to the network:

- 1. Connect the module's cable **1** to the low-profile connector **2** on the module (see Figure 2−3).
- 2. Attach the other end of the cable to a standard UTP Category 5 cable, such as an unshielded twisted-pair office crossover cable (PN BNG25H-03), or an 8-pin MP to 8-pin MP TIA-EIA straight cable (PN BNG25G).

3. Observe the module's LED **③**. The green LED lights and stays lit when the module is connected to the network device properly. If you observe any other indication, see Table 2−1 to isolate and correct the problem.

Table 2-1 lists problems you may encounter when you connect the module to a network device.

The fault analysis in Table 2–1 assumes that the computer was operating properly before you began the installation process and that the self-test passes with the cable attached.

Verifying the PMC Adapter on the Network

To verify that the module is operational in the network, use the ping, telnet/rlogin, and ftp services of your TCP/IP environments.

- To establish a valid 100-Mb/s connection, connect a UTP Category 5 cable either point-to-point, or to a 100BASE-TX hub.
- To establish a valid 10-Mb/s connection, connect a UTP Category 3, 4, or 5 cable either point-to-point, or to a 10BASE-T hub.

Refer to Figure B–1 in Appendix B for the connector pin assignments. Installation of the module is now complete.

Problem Solving

Table A-1 describes the possible causes of an inoperational Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter module and their solutions. Use this table when you have finished the installation but there is no display or response from the keyboard.

General Information

This appendix provides general system specifications and cabling requirements for the Fast EtherWORKS/PMC Adapter module.

Physical Description

The PMC Adapter module is a PMC that uses the 32-bit PCI bus connector. The module measures 149 mm by 74 mm, and is constructed using four-layer circuit board technology with two signal layers and two power/ground layers.

Functional Components

The PMC Adapter module consists of the following components:

- \bullet Single low-profile RJ-45 connector that operates at either 10 Mb/s or 100 Mb/s
- DECchip 21140
- Three LEDs that indicate speed, transmit and receive network activity, and link status
- Cable that connects the RJ-45 connector to the appropriate Ethernet connector.

LEDs

The LEDs are used to indicate the status of the module and its connector. These LEDs are visible on the module's front panel (at the back of your system). During diagnostics, the module's Activity LED blinks once, then remains lit. Once the network software and device driver(s) are loaded, the LEDs reflect status. Table B–1 describes the LEDs.

LED	Color	Description
100 Mb/s status	Amber	This LED lights when 100-Mb/s mode is selected and does not light when 10-Mb/s mode is selected.
Activity status	Amber	This LED lights when there is transmit and receive network activity.
Link status	Green	This LED lights to indicate a good network connection and does not light when the link is in a failed state.



Cabling Requirements

Use one of the following cable types, or its equivalent, to connect the PMC Adapter module's cable to the network. The maximum length supported by the Ethernet is 100 meters of UTP cable for both speeds. The "xx" denotes cable length in meters for each of the following Digital part numbers.

The increased performance and capacity of personal computers along with the availability of cost-effective, high-resolution peripherals have fueled the development of high-performance, data-intensive applications such as graphical user interfaces, computer-aided engineering, computer-aided training, groupware, image processing, document management, network resource libraries, and multi-media.

The effective utilization of these new, high-performance systems at the desktop demands new low-cost, high-performance LAN interface technologies. The computer LAN industry has responded with several new technologies to address price, bandwidth, and availability. These include:

- FDDI (shared and switched, with/without full duplex)
- Fast Ethernet (100BASE-TX/FX/T4-shared and switched access, with/without full duplex)
- ATM
- 100VG-AnyLan

Of all of these technologies, Fast Ethernet (100BASE-T), is a technology that can be integrated into current 10BASE-T LANs and allow them to scale easily to 100 Mb/s. Fast Ethernet provides higher bandwidth without a major change in infrastructure and will be supported on every major platform, delivering an excellent business solution to the increasing requirements for bandwidth on the LAN.

Advantages of Fast Ethernet

Key advantages of the Fast Ethernet are:

- High performance
- Standards-based technology
- Cost-effective migration
- Vendor support

High Performance

One of the compelling reasons to choose Fast Ethernet for workgroups is the ability to handle both the aggregate demands of multiple LAN users and the peak traffic created by today's high-performance PCs and sophisticated bandwidth-intensive applications. When high burst rates are key, Fast Ethernet is the right workgroup solution.

Standards-Based Technology

The standard for Fast Ethernet technology is being set by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) 802.3 Committee, the same committee that developed the original Ethernet standard. This technology is designed to be the most direct and simple evolutionary extension of 10BASE-T Ethernet. The key to its simplicity is Fast Ethernet's use of proven Carrier Sense Multiple Access/Collision Detection (CSMA/CD) protocol, defined in the Ethernet Media Access Control (MAC) layer.

The 100BASE-T MAC is a scaled up version of the MAC used in 10 Mb/s Ethernet. In other words, 100BASE-T is conventional Ethernet, only faster. It has the same reliable, robust, and economical technology that users rely on today.

Additionally, both technologies can be offered with shared or switched Ethernet connections. Shared environments provide a total of 10 or 100 Mb/s to all stations attached to a hub. They are ideal for a medium size workgroup with occasional peak bandwidth demands. Shared Ethernet delivers the bandwidth at very low cost.

Cost-Effective Migration

The seamless compatibility between 10BASE-T and 100BASE-T allows easy migration to high-speed connects. Migration is simple and economical in many important areas:

- LAN cabling 100BASE-T media specifications (100BASE-TX, 100BASE-FX, and 100BASE-T4) enable Fast Ethernet to run on the most common Ethernet wiring including Categories 3, 4, and 5 unshielded twisted-pair (UTP), shielded twisted-pair (STP), and fiber.
- Administrative expertise Managers can rely on familiar network analysis tools and procedures in 100BASE-T environments. Administrative information translates easily from 10 Mb/s Ethernet to Fast Ethernet networks, which means minimal retraining of MIS support staff. Administrators as well as system integrators already know the technology, cabling, protocols, and software used in 100BASE-T networks.
- Management software Fast Ethernet LANs can be managed with existing Simple Network Management Protocol (SNMP) management application software and today's Ethernet management information bases (MIBs).
- Software support Application and networking software will function unchanged on 100BASE-T LANs.
- Flexible migration Automatic speed selection where adapters can run at either 10 or 100 Mb/s on existing wire ensures nondisruptive transition to Fast Ethernet. Similarly, 10/100 Mb/s Ethernet switching hubs will enable smooth migration to Fast Ethernet in the wiring closet.

Vendor Support

Fast Ethernet enjoys the support of the largest number of network adapters, network systems, and systems' vendors. The extensive multivendor support will ensure the development of a wide range of interoperable products at very competitive prices. The result: Fast Ethernet will offer the lowest price of all 100 Mb/s technologies for migrating 10 Mb/s Ethernet to higher bandwidth.

Summary

Although not all users require 100 Mb/s network performance to the desktop today, many LAN intensive applications already push the limits of existing 10 Mb/s LANs, and can benefit from 100 Mb/s technology now. Emerging data-intensive applications and technologies (such as multimedia, groupware, imaging, and client-server databases) will soon make 100 Mb/s networking a critical part of most LANs. Meanwhile, as network servers become more powerful, they are being relocated from local connections to the data center, where they need 100 Mb/s high-speed connections to the network backbone to provide cost-effective, centralized performance.

Fast Ethernet technology is true Ethernet and can coexist with 10BASE-T. It protects past investment in network products and training by leveraging the value of existing 10BASE-T cabling, the experience of 50 million Ethernet users, the expertise of network managers, the capabilities of established network management applications, and the wealth of installed hardware and software products.
