Introduction

Storage Area Networks (SANs) can be deployed across geographically distributed locations using dedicated fiber connections of up to 10 km; however, many applications require deployment of a SAN with elements connected over a Wide Area Network (WAN).

The Compaq StorageWorks SAN Switch Remote Switch feature, in conjunction with the Computer Network Technology (CNT) Ultranet Open Systems Gateway TM (OSG), allows the connection of two Compaq StorageWorks SAN Switches over an Asynchronous Transfer Mode (ATM) link. The two switches are cascaded together to form a fabric. To connected hosts and storage devices, the remote switches appear to be connected locally. The Remote Switch feature supports a maximum of two switches in a fabric.

Advantages of the Remote Switch feature include:

- Any-to-any connectivity—A host connected on either the local or remote switch can communicate with storage devices at either location.
- **Coordinated fabric services**—The Remote Switch fabric configuration supports all fabric services, including Distributed Name Services, Registered State Change Notifications, and Alias Services.
- **Distributed management**—Access to the management facilities (Telnet, SNMP, and Web Management Tools) is available from either the local or the remote switch. The interconnect for switch management is routed through the Fibre Channel connection. No additional network connection is required between sites.

Operation

The Remote Switch fabric operates in conjunction with the CNT Ultranet OSG. The Ultranet OSG provides a Fibre Channel physical interface that functions as an E_Port and an ATM physical interface.

The Ultranet OSG accepts Fibre Channel frames from one side of a Remote Switch fabric. To transfer across the WAN, the frames are broken into smaller pieces at the local end of the ATM network. The pieces are tunnelled inside ATM cells that are transmitted through the ATM network. At the remote end of the ATM network, the Fibre Channel frames are reassembled and transmitted through the remote Fibre Channel interface to the other side of the Remote Switch fabric.

To accomplish this, the Ultranet OSG provides an E_Port interface that links to the E_Port of a Compaq StorageWorks SAN Switch. When the link between the two E_Ports is negotiated, the Ultranet OSG E_Port moves to pass-through mode and passes Fibre Channel traffic from the switch's E_Port to the ATM network.

Installation

A Remote Switch fabric requires two Compaq StorageWorks SAN Switches. Both switches require a Remote Switch license key. Information about obtaining a license key is provided in the Remote Switch option kit.

Adding a License Key

To install the Remote Switch license key:

- 1. Log on to the switch as admin through a Telnet connection.
- 2. At the prompt, enter the Telnet command

licenseAdd "key"

where "key" is the license key string of alphanumeric characters in double quotes. Enter the license key string exactly as it is given.

3. At the prompt, enter the Telnet command

licenseShow

A list of installed license keys displays. Verify that the Remote Switch license key is active.

Forming Remote Switch Fabrics

A Remote Switch fabric requires two Compaq StorageWorks SAN Switches. Both switches require a Remote Switch license key and both switches must be identically configured. In addition to normal switch configuration options, three additional parameters must be configured:

- Timeout Values
- Data field size
- Class F frame suppression

These values can be changed through Telnet with a single configure command.

Time Out Values

Both switches participating in the Remote Switch fabric should increase the Resource Allocation Time Out Value (R_A_TOV) and the Error Detect Time Out Value (E_D_TOV) to accommodate the possible increase in transit time caused by the introduction of WAN links to the fabric. To increase the time out values, use the configure command during a Telnet session. For Data Replication Manager solutions using the Ultranet OSG, enter the following values:

- R_A_TOV—10000
- E_D_TOV—5000

Data Field Size

Both switches participating in the Remote Switch fabric must have the data field size configured to the maximum of 2048 bytes. Data field sizes smaller than 2048 bytes can be set, but significant performance degradation can result.

To set the data field size, use the configure command during a Telnet session. Enter 2048 next to the Data field size option.

Class F Frame

Both switches participating in the Remote Switch fabric must have the Class F frame suppression flag set.

To set the frame suppression flag, use the configure command during a Telnet session. Enter 1 next to the Suppress Class F Traffic option.

Definition of Terms

Asynchronous Transfer Mode

The Asynchronous Transfer Mode (ATM) is a broadband technology for transmitting data over LANs or WANs based on relaying cells of a fixed size. ATM provides any-to-any connectivity, and nodes can transmit simultaneously.

Class F

Class F is a class of service used for interswitch control traffic. It provides connectionless service with notification of delivery or nondelivery of frames between two E_Ports.

E_Port

An E Port is a port that is used as an interswitch expansion port. It connects to the E_Port of another switch to build a larger switch fabric.

Error Detect Time Out Value

The Error Detect Time Out Value (E_D_TOV) defines the time the switch waits for an expected response before declaring an error condition. The E_D_TOV is adjustable from two to ten seconds in 1-second increments.

Fabric

A fabric is a network comprised of high-speed fiber connections resulting from the interconnection of switches and devices. A fabric is an active and intelligent nonshared interconnect scheme for nodes.

Gateway

A gateway is hardware that connects incompatible networks by providing the necessary translation for hardware and software.

Resource Allocation Time Out Value

The Resource Allocation Time Out Value (R_A_TOV) is used to time out operations that depend on the maximum possible time that a frame could be delayed in a fabric and still be delivered. The R_A_TOV is adjustable from 10 to 120 seconds in 1-second increments.

Tunneling

Tunneling is a technique for making two different networks work together where the source and destination hosts are on the same type of network, but there is a different network in between them.
