



VERITAS Volume Manager 4.0 and VERITAS File System 4.0 Software Release Notes Supplement

This supplements the *VERITAS Volume Manager 4.0 Release Notes* and the *VERITAS File System 4.0 Release Notes*.

Unsupported Products

To ensure compatibility of VERITAS products on Sun platforms, Sun and VERITAS perform significant joint testing. However, Sun does not provide front-line support for VERITAS products that are not price-listed by Sun. In an effort to make sure all joint customer support issues are resolved efficiently, Sun and VERITAS have implemented the Cooperative Support model under the Sun VIP program. Under this program, customers who hold a Spectrum GOLD or PLATINUM support contract with Sun and a support contract with VERITAS can engage either company for support and resolution. Sun and VERITAS will engage each other as appropriate to solve joint (or unidentified) issues.

Sun StorEdge T3 Array Support in a Multi-Host Environment

In a multi-host environment, the Sun StorEdge T3 array should be configured in MPxIO mode (explicit failover or `nonauto_trespass` mode). Use the `sys mp_support mpxio` command on the Sun StorEdge T3 array to enable the MPxIO mode.

In this mode, use the Sun StorEdge Traffic Manager (SSTM) driver to handle I/O multi-pathing. To enable multi-pathing through SSTM, edit the `/kernel/drv/scsi_vhci.conf` file on the hosts to enable the MPxIO mode by setting the value of SSTM property `mpxio-disable` to "no" (for example, `mpxio-disable= no`).
