

Sun Fire™ V60x and Sun Fire V65x Servers

3.2 GHz CPU BIOS Requirements

New 3.2 GHz CPUs have been qualified for the Sun Fire™ V60x and Sun Fire V65x servers. However, these CPUs require Sun™ BIOS version 1191 or later to be installed on the server.

1. Identify your new CPU version.

The 3.2 GHz CPU is shipped in a box that has the following Intel part number printed on the side:

- Intel MM# 855692

If your CPU has this part number, you must install Sun™ BIOS 1191 or later to the server for the new CPU to function properly.

2. Identify your current Sun BIOS version (if necessary).

- a. Reboot the server.
- b. Press the F2 key to select SETUP as soon as the option appears on the screen.
- c. Once you are in the main page of the SETUP menu, use the arrow key to select the Server menu.
- d. In the Server screen, select the System Management option, then press Enter.

The BIOS and other firmware revisions are shown on the display. An example for BIOS 1191 is shown here:

BIOS version: [SWV25.86B.1191.P08]
```

3. Download and install Sun BIOS 1191 (if necessary).
